

ORDINANCE NO. 53

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR REGULATION OF DEPOSITING OF REFUSE OR LITTER IN THE VILLAGE OF NEWYORK MILLS FOR THE REGULATION OF DUMP GROUNDS OWNED BY THE VILLAGE OF NEW YORK MILLS, AND PROVIDING CHARGES FOR USE OF DUMP USE OF DUMP GROUND FACILITIES.

The Village Council of the Village of New York Mills, Minn. do hereby ordain as follows.

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.

SUBDIVISION (1). The term "dump ground" means a tract of land owned, maintained, and designated by the Village of New York Mills, either inside or outside of the corporate limits of the Village, for the purpose of depositing or dumping of refuse.

SUBDIVISION (2). The term "caretaker" shall mean a person employed by the Village Council of the Village of New York Mills to be in charge of any dump ground owned and maintained by the Village of New York Mills under the direction of the Village Council, and to enforce the observance of the rules and regulations adopted by the Village in the use thereof. In carrying out his duties, the caretaker shall have the authority of a peace officer in the enforcement of the provisions of this ordinance, Minnesota Statutes 609.68 and the laws of the State of Minnesota and the ordinances of the Village of New York Mills amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto.

SUBDIVISION (3). The term "refuse" shall mean any garbage, rubbish, debris, waste matter, refuse, or other unwholesome substance but shall not mean the bodies of dead animals.

SECTION 2. HOURS OF USE. The regular hours during which the dump grounds shall be open to the public for dumping of refuse shall be between the hours of 8:00 o'clock in the morning and 5:30 o'clock in the afternoon on each Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday. The dump grounds may be open at other times when the caretaker is actually present at the dump ground and the gate to the dump ground is open.

SECTION 3. COMPENSATION OF CARETAKER. The caretaker shall receive such minimum salary as the Village Council shall prescribe for the performance of his duties as such caretaker and in addition, he shall be entitled to collect and retain the charges or fees imposed by this ordinance for the use of the dump ground as additional compensation for the performance of his duties as such caretaker.

SECTION 4. CHARGES FOR USE. The following charges shall be imposed upon each motor entering the dump ground and shall be paid by the occupant of the vehicle to the caretaker before any refuse is unloaded therefrom:

Private passenger car type of motor vehicle-25¢
 Pickup truck, or private passenger car with trailer-50¢
 Any truck other than a pickup truck-\$1.00.

SECTION 5. REGULATIONS AND PROHIBITIONS. The following regulations shall apply to the maintenance and use of the dump ground of the Village of New York Mills and any violations of such regulations is hereby declared unlawful:

SUBDIVISION (1). No person shall place, deposit or dump any refuse at or upon the dump ground at a time when the dump ground is not open to the public, nor with out payment of the charge imposed by this ordinance.

SUBDIVISION (2). Refuse shall be placed, deposited or dumped only upon such location within the dump ground as the caretaker shall designate and direct and placing, depositing or dumping of refuse upon any other part of the dump ground is prohibited.

SUBDIVISION (3). No person other than the caretaker shall ignite any fire upon the dump ground.

SUBDIVISION (4). No dead animal bodies shall be deposited or left at or upon the dump ground.

SUBDIVISION (5). No person shall place, deposit, or dump refuse or litter on the public streets or highways, nor upon public lands within the corporate limits of the Billage of New York Mills, nor upon lands owned by the Village of New York Mills outside of its corporate limits, except within the fenced area of a duly designated dump ground.

SUBDIVISION (6). No person shall throw, refuse over any fence onto the dump ground.

Section 6. Penalty. Any person violating this ordinance, or any section or subdivision hereof, shall be punished by a fine not to exceed One Hundred Dollars (100.00 dollars) or by imprisonment for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days.

Section 7. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and dffect from and after the date of its publication.
