

ORDINANCE NO. 7

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE OPENING OF ANY STREET WITHOUT WRITTEN PERMISSION? AND THE INTERFERRING OF WITH ANY VILLAGE PROPERTY.

THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF NEW YORK MILLS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1.

That any person who shall open any part of the street within this Village, for any purpose, without first obtaining written permission from the Village so to do, shall be guilty of the breach of peace.

SECTION 2.

That any person tapping, boring any hole, and or in any manner handling any waterworks system and equipment within the said Village, without first obtaining a written permission from the Village to do so, shall be guilty of a breach of the peace.

SECTION 3.

That any digging, scraping, plowing, excavating, and or drilling of any hole, in any public street of this Village shall be considered opening such street; that fitting any pipe connection, valve, wrench, and or any other implement to any part of the waterworks system between the outlet part of the water meter connected to such waterworks system, shall be held to constitute a handling of parts of such waterworks system within the meaning of this act; that the water meter used in connection with the water system shall be considered a part of such water system and any opening, screwing of bolts, loosening of any part of such meter, and in any manner interfering with said meter shall be considered a handling within the meaning of this act.

SECTION 4.

That any person found guilty of a breach of the peace as herein described shall be sentenced to pay a fine not exceeding One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), and the sentence shall provide that in the default of payment of such fine that such convicted person shall be confined in the County Jail as provided by law for such term as such sentence shall provide, not exceeding ninety (90) days.
